Once completed, you must have a parent/guardian sign the bottom of this page verifying that they have completed each box as indicated. This form and your reading response activity are to be turned in to your homeroom teacher by Thursday, August 17th.

Beginner Diver: ALL students who successfully complete the "Bingo" activity, and turn it in on time, will earn a pizza & ice cream lunch (date to be determined).



Intermediate Diver: Students who first complete a "Bingo", then complete additional boxes for 6-15 boxes total, will be entered in a drawing to win up to \$15 in books.*



Pro Diver: Students who first complete a "Bingo", then complete additional boxes for 16-25 boxes total, will be entered in a drawing to win up to \$25 in books.*
