• Presentation of the 2013-14 School Improvement Plan: Presented by Kelly Jacobson Kelly Jacobson summarized our School Improvement plan. We have three school based leadership teams: Team Leaders (help make day to day operation decisions), CLTs (Collaborative Learning Teams), and 2C.it (casts our vision for years to come). Kate Houston put together a new teacher mentoring program this year which our new teachers participated in before school started this year. This allowed our new teachers to hit the ground running so they could be focused on student achievement right from the start. The RTI/MTSS process of identifying students who may need extra help was reviewed. Our Annual Measurable Objectives (AMO) are set by the state and include: 70% students score a 4.0 or better on FCAT Writes, 83% score a 3 or better on FCAT Reading and Math or EOC assessments, and 78% score 4.0 or better on FCAT Science. There are Early Warning Systems in place to help watch for indicators alerting us to students who may not meet the goals. We'd like to increase parent involvement by making more opportunities available in the classroom, helping in small groups, and proctoring. Good character is valued and will be recognized within PBMS and in the community. Cat Cash will be starting soon which is awarded to students who are demonstrating good character and can be redeemed for ice pops or eating outside on reward days or saved up to spend in the Cat Cash store. Mrs. Teifer sponsors the Be the Change club which also exemplifies Character Counts. Our top three goals this year are to improve writing skills, for all teachers to implement high yield instructional strategies aligned with Common Core, and to improve students' ability to support and explain answers to math problems using critical thinking skills.
