Positive Activities with Students- academic related

Remediation, enrichment, etc.

Kids get excited about PAWS time

4 core teachers choose different opportunities

Ex: mummy wrapping, rock painting around campus, review games

Allows opportunities to meet and interact with other students

Allows for more classroom growth as opposed to reteaching the whole class

Students and teachers have really enjoyed PAWS!

All students are logging HW in their planners due to PAWS

Students without their planners are sent to Mr. Chiodo

Kids get "pawed" or stamped in their planners letting them know where they should go on PAWS day

Stamps/Paws are used for positive sessions as well as remediation sessions.

Each week has a subject priority

Coach Hawkinson- Teacher PAWS Spotlight

Uses PAWS time for WEB every other week

6th graders meet with their 8th grade mentors

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PAWS has allowed more social/peer interaction with mentors

Other PE includes Presidential fitness testing

Kids have been using their planners consistently and are responsible with where they should go

40 minute student chosen activities or re-test/remediation to reach struggling students

Students are eager to get to their activities and have to be reminded to walk in the hallways 😊

Open sessions are for any student

Closed sessions are for specific students who have a paw stamp in their planner

If all 3 options are full students can report to study hall
