 - Grade level community service
 - Character development through "Character Counts!"
 - Wildcat Way
- Goal 3: Student and Staff Support Systems
 - WEB (Where Everybody Belongs) anti-bullying and student support
 - Wildcat Mentoring Program recruitment and retention
 - There will be 17 new staff members next school year
 - Schoology Student and parent communication
 - Will take the place of Edmodo
 - Allow for better communication between teacher/student/parents
 - All middle and high schools in the district will have Schoology
 - Professional Development (PD) Curriculum maps and instructional model
 - Triple E Stream lining Marzano elements
 - o Positive Activities with Students (PAWS) Student enrichment and remediation
 - This will continue next year

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- Professional Learning Communities (PLC) Teacher instructional development
 - Structures what we do as curriculum teams
- o iTeams Grade level student cohort programming for students

Good News from Mr. Willets

- 1475 projected students
- 6 additional classrooms
 - o 7th grade ELA team will be in the new portables
- 7:25 homeroom access
 - Will help with traffic and breakfast
 - Walkers/Bike-Riders/Skateboarders will be allowed inside at 7:15
 - Students will report straight to homeroom in the morning
- Addition of new/expanded elective courses
 - Adding an art class
 - o Media Productions
 - Adding a technology class
 - Adding a section of theater
- Addition of academic core and ESE programming (growth positions)
 - Mr. Willets has hired 8 new positions
- 7 period day
 - No block classes
 - o Pure lunches 6,7,8
- Emphasis on preparing students for high school programming
 - o IB/Dual Enrollment, AICE, Academy Options
- Additional Assistant Principal
 - 10 month position
- Growth, school systems, and the future...
 - o Nease feeder pattern the largest in the district
 - 26 portables currently
 - o Making sure systems are created and are consistent

 - O What updates are there on education legislation?
 - Large bill passed, waiting on Governor
 - Possibly moving FSA closer to the school year
 - Reduced monies about \$27 fewer dollars per student

 - EOC grades count for 30% of overall grade
