Science Presentation

These new items include STEM SPARK, TECH TREK, Science Olympiad, and the Science Fair in the 8th grade. One of Mrs. Hicks' students were chose for Tech Trek this school year. Needs Assessment Survey Review

Mr. Willets addressed the needs assessment survey stating that 19% of the parents have filled out the online survey. The data is very consistent with lasts years survey. One need that Mr. Willets addressed is the parent need for information about programs available for next year. Another really important topic on the survey was the question about student safety. The doors are now key coded and the building is more secure now. [sales tax] Funds were used to update the camera systems and access will be given to the sheriffs department. Mr. Willets mentioned the comments on safety from parents showed that they are pleased with how we have addresses safety as the bay. Another high need for parents was requesting more information about clubs and group meetings will be readily available for students to access next school year.
